

The Norwood Arts Show is another popular annual event, highlighting the talent of Art and Technology students.

# Leadership and Student Voice

Students at Norwood are strongly encouraged to participate in a broad range of programs providing opportunities for leadership development across all year levels, from Class Captains in Year 7 to College Captains and Prefects in Year 12. Leadership fundraising efforts not only support College improvements but contribute financially to a large number of social causes selected by the students. #### Mentoring

# POSITIVE DIRECTIONS

### YEAR 7

Ensuring a successful transition into Secondary School is a key focus of the first year in establishing strong foundations. Our Transition Program begins well before Year 7 begins. Strong relationships exist between Norwood and its feeder Primary Schools. Our top priorities are to promote a sense of belonging, to encourage children to explore their individual interests and to promote a culture of always doing their best.

Highly able and interested students are encouraged to apply for the Norwood Enrichment Program which commences in Year 7.

Year 7 students experience the personal care of a Mentor Teacher with whom they can develop strong and positive relationships. They have fewer teachers and have many of their classes in their Home Room. Peer Support Leaders act as positive role models, providing friendship and assistance. A structured transition camp fosters strong and positive relationships between teachers and students.

### YEAR 8

A diverse curriculum promotes an active involvement in the learning process and emphasises the fundamental skills of literacy, numeracy, technological competency and investigation. The first two years of Secondary School provide students with a broad curriculum experience, providing them with a sound base to make informed decisions about subject choices. Year 8 students challenge themselves at the Summit Camp, setting individual goals and building upon teamwork skills.

#### YEAR 9

Whilst the core subjects of English, Mathematics, Science, Humanities and Physical Education remain central to a student's program, they are encouraged to seek a deeper understanding of the world and its cultures. Students are encouraged to select from a broad range of electives, including the popular Outdoor Education program. A range of off-campus experiences, including City Experience and a range of curriculum-based excursions, enriches learning.

#### YEAR 10

In Year 10, preparation for the VCE begins in earnest. Students are encouraged to assume greater responsibility for their learning and to become more complex thinkers, capable of independent learning. A rigorous curriculum provides a solid foundation for the important senior years ahead, with many students encouraged to access the VCE early.

It is important to nurture new levels of confidence, achievement and ambition. Work Experience encourages students to begin thinking about life after school. The Presentation Ball continues to be a highlight for students and popular with families. A Ski Camp offers a new experience for many.

### YEAR 11

As students embark on their VCE studies they establish important, collaborative partnerships with their teachers. While students at this stage are increasingly independent, the College continues to monitor student progress and encourages strong support networks both at home and at school.

The College offers a diverse range of VCE subjects. A range of Vocational Educational Training (VET) subjects are available to complement the VCE. Entry into the VCE Vocational Major class at Year 11 & 12 is available to Norwood students who satisfy key selection criteria.

Highlights of the exciting co-curricular program include participating in the popular Central Australian Tour and the Year 11 Formal.

#### YEAR 12

Year 12 students are well supported by their teachers who are passionate about the subjects they teach, inspirational and committed to the students in their classes. A dedicated study centre provides a valuable learning space.

Norwood has a strong tradition of VCE excellence with the vast majority of students entering University or further training.

Careers counselling is an integral part of the senior years, ensuring all students are supported in making informed choices about career pathways. The Year 12 journey is supported by formal study programs, revision sessions, practice examinations and guest speakers. The experience is enhanced by the Year 12 Formal and Valedictory Dinner.

# OUR COLLEGE

Norwood Secondary College, in North Ringwood, is a single campus co-educational College located in a secure treed residential environment close to the civic and commercial centres of the City of Maroondah.

Norwood has a very high reputation in the community, particularly with regard to student endeavour in academic, sport and music programs and as a consequence draws students from a wide geographic area. The College is well serviced by several bus routes.

The College continues to be unable to meet demand with more students applying each year in Year 7 than can be accommodated. The College has an agreed enrolment limit across Years 7-12 of 1100 students.

The College has spacious and attractive grounds looking out onto breathtaking vistas of the Dandenong Ranges. A double court gymnasium complex and purpose-built STEM Centre are recent additions to the College. The first stage of a whole school Masterplan is now complete providing students with modern and spacious classrooms, as well as breakout study spaces. The School Council is committed to the improvement and enhancement of College facilities now and into the future.
